3: A BayStack 470-48T is initially being configured:

It is necessary to send the Simple Network Management Protocol (SNMP) traps to an Optivity Network Management System (NMS) so that the switch can be monitored.

Using the Console Interface menus, the SNMP Configuration screen has been entered.

To specify a trap receiver, both an IP address and a Community String must be specified.

What is the requirement for the community string when defining a trap receiver?

A.It must be the read community string for the BayStack 470-48T.

B.It must be the read-write community string for the BayStack 470-48T.

C.It must be a community string that has been defined on the Optivity NMS for the BayStack 470-48T.

4: Port-based VLAN 10 has been configured on a standalone BayStack 470-24T switch. Port 5 must now be added to VLAN 10.

What are the steps necessary to add Port 5 to VLAN 10 in Java Device Manager (JDM)?

A.From the main menu choose Application-> LAN-> VLAN Configuration . In the VLAN Table section, click the Modify icon for VLAN 10 . Now add Port 5 to the list of members.

B.Highlight Port 5 on the device, and from the main menu choose Edit -> Port . Now click on the VLAN tab, and in the DefaultVlanId field, enter 10, and click Apply.

C.From the main menu choose Edit-> VLANs. Double click on Port Members for VLAN 10,

and add Port 5 to the list of members.

D.From the main menu choose VLAN-> VLANs. Double click on Port Members for VLAN 10, and add Port 5 to the list of members.

### 5: Given the following situation:

A Business Policy Switch (BPS) 2000 switch is removed from a hybrid stack of BPS 2000 and BayStack 450-24T switches, and is being set up as a standalone switch.

The BPS 2000 switch was eset to Default Settings through the Console Interface menus.

When reconfiguration of the BPS 2000 switch was attempted, it was noticed that two VLANs can NOT be defined in separate Spanning Tree Groups (STGs).

What is the most likely cause for this situation?

A.The software version is not at a current level and must be upgraded to Version 2.0 or later.

B.The eset to Default Settings has not been implemented, since the console password used to access the switch did not have Read-Write privileges.

C.The switch is still in hybrid mode, since eset to Default Settings will not reset the stack mode.

D.The eset to Default Settings has not been implemented, since the switch must be physically power cycled for the changes to take effect.
